SECTION I. INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

1.01 <u>Invitation to Bid</u>: The Champaign Park District is soliciting bids from contractors to furnish all labor, material, supplies, equipment, and supervision to fully replace the existing asphalt shingle roofing systems with new standing seam metal roofing on three (3) separate concession and restroom buildings located within Dodds Park, as outlined in the specifications.

- 1.02 <u>Due Date</u>: Sealed bids shall be delivered or mailed to **Champaign Park District**, **706 Kenwood Road, Champaign, Illinois 61821, by 1:30 p.m.** prevailing time on **Thursday, January 30, 2025**, at which time bids will be opened and publicly read. Facsimile copies and late bids will not be accepted.
- 1.03 <u>Bid Understanding</u>: By submitting a bid, the bidder agrees and assures that the specifications are adequate, and the bidder accepts the terms and conditions, specifications and requirements of work to be completed. Failure to do so will be at the bidder's risk and they cannot secure relief on the plea of error.
- 1.04 <u>Submission of Bid</u>: All bids shall be submitted on the **Bidder's Response Forms** and accompanied by requested information including the **Champaign Park District Commitment to Engage in Affirmative Action Practices forms**. All blank spaces shall be properly filled in, in ink or typewritten, in both words and figures, and with no other conditions, changes, erasures or interlineations. Bids shall be signed and executed by a principal duly authorized to make contracts.

Bids shall be enclosed in an envelope sealed and clearly marked with the words: "**BID DOCUMENT: ROOF REPLACEMENTS**" The bidder shall put their name and address on the outside of the envelope.

The Champaign Park District shall not be responsible for the premature opening of bid envelopes, which are not properly filled out in accordance with the instructions.

- 1.05 <u>Site Visits</u>: It shall be the sole responsibility of the bidder to inspect the location(s) prior to submitting a bid. No variation in price or conditions shall be permitted based upon a claim of ignorance. Submission of a bid shall be considered evidence that the bidder has familiarized himself/herself with the nature and extent of the work, and the equipment, materials and labor required.
- 1.06 <u>Awards Criteria</u>: Award will be to the lowest priced, responsible bidder if all other requirements are satisfactorily met. The Champaign Park District reserves the right to reject any and all bids, waive technicalities and irregularities and/or to award the contract only to a bidder who is equipped, competent and experienced in the class of work and whose bid is deemed to be advantageous to the interests of the Champaign Park District.
- 1.07 <u>Rejection of Bids</u>: The Park District reserves the right to reject any, all, or any part of a bid, and waive any or all irregularities and select the bid that is in its best interest. The Park District reserves the right to reject the bid of any bidder who previously failed to perform adequately for the Park District or any other governmental agency or company.
- 1.08 <u>Withdrawal</u>: Bidder may make a written request to modify or withdraw the offer at any time prior to the opening. Bids may not be modified after submittal or withdrawn or modified after bid opening. Withdrawal of bids will be allowed if award of contract has been delayed more than 60 days, after date of actual bid opening.
- 1.09 <u>Inquiries</u>: Questions and comments regarding this solicitation should be directed to the **Bret** Johnson, Assistant Director of Operations & Planning, at Bresnan Meeting Center, 706

Kenwood Road, Champaign, Illinois 61821 or by calling **217-819-3850**. Written answers to questions of a general nature or which would affect the solicitation will be provided to all eligible bidders. Only written answers to the questions shall be binding.

SECTION II. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 2.01 <u>Definitions</u>: *Owner* shall mean the Champaign Park District. *Contractor* shall mean party of the second part to this contract, acting directly or through his or its legal representative(s) or agent(s). *Subcontractor* shall mean persons, firms or corporations having a direct contract with the contractor, and those who contract to furnish labor or labor and materials at the site of the project.
- 2.02 <u>Contract Documents</u>: The contract entered into by the parties shall consist of the Instructions to Bidder, Terms and Conditions, Specifications, and Bid Forms including all modifications thereof, and a purchase order, if applicable, requiring signatures of the Champaign Park District and the Contractor, all of which shall be referred to collectively as the Contract Documents.
- 2.03 <u>Payments</u>: Contractor shall submit invoice to the District by the 1st Friday of the month. Late submissions will be pushed to the next month's billing by the Park District. Payment will be monthly after Board approval of the bills, which is the 2nd Wednesday of each month.
- 2.04 <u>Taxes</u>: The District is exempt from any taxes imposed by State and/or Federal Government. Exemption certificates will be provided upon request.
- 2.05 <u>Cancellation/Termination</u>: The Park District may cancel this contract for convenience by providing thirty (30) calendar days advance notice to the contractor.

The Park District may cancel this contract for cause (i.e., fails to meet deadlines, fails to provide agreed upon service, etc.) at any time by giving one week's written notice to the contractor. The termination of the contract will be issued only after the District deems that the contractor has failed to remedy the problem after being forewarned.

The Contractor may cancel this contract for convenience or cause by providing thirty (30) calendar days advance notice to the District.

- 2.06 <u>Compliance or Deviation to Specifications</u>: Bidder hereby agrees that the equipment or services offered will meet all the requirements of the specifications in this solicitation unless deviations from them are clearly indicated in the Bidder's response. Bidder may submit an attachment entitled "Exceptions for Specification", which must be signed by Bidder's authorized representative. An explanation must be made for each item to which an exception is taken, giving in detail the extent of the exception and the reason for which it is taken. Bids failing to comply with this requirement will be considered non-responsive.
- 2.07 <u>Compliance with Ordinances and Statutes and Notice of Special Conditions</u>: Every bidder shall comply with the requirements of the Affirmative Action Regulations of the Champaign Park District, Illinois Fair Employment Act, Illinois Prevailing Wage Act, Equal Opportunity regulations and other Federal and State of Illinois regulations and guidelines applicable to the contract.
- 2.08 <u>Assignment and Subcontracts</u>: The Contractor shall not assign this contract or any part thereof without written consent of the Park District, nor shall the Contractor award any work under this contract to any subcontractor without prior written approval from the Director of Operations or the Executive Director. Nothing contained in the contract documents shall create a contractual relation between any subcontractor and the Owner. Any subcontractor assigned must meet the same requirements as the Contractor awarded the bid.
- 2.09 <u>Independent Contractor</u>: The contractor acknowledges and agrees that the Contractor is not an employee of the Park District, is not entitled to any benefits or protections afforded employees of the Park District, nor bound by any obligations of employees of the Park District. Nevertheless, the

Contractor will not act contrary to the policies of the Park District. The Contractor understands and fully agrees that the Contractor will not be insured under provisions of the unemployment compensation insurance of the Park District or the workers' compensation insurance of the Park District, and that any injury or property damage in connection with the work performed will be the Contractor's sole responsibility and not that of the Park District. It is also understood that the Contractor is not protected as an employee or as a person acting as an agent or employee under the provisions of the general liability insurance of the Park District and, therefore, the Contractor will be solely responsible for the Contractor's own acts or omissions, and those of the Contractor's employees and agents, if any. The Park District will not in any manner whatsoever be obligated to defend, indemnify or hold harmless the Contractor, or the Contractor's employees and agents, if any, in matters of liability.

- 2.10 Indemnification: Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless District and its officers, officials, employees, volunteers and agents from and against all claims, damages, losses and expenses, including but not limited to legal fees (attorneys' and paralegals' fees and court costs) arising out of or resulting from the performance of Contractor's work, provided that any such claim, damage, loss or expense (i) is attributable to bodily injury, sickness, disease or death, or injury to or destruction of tangible property, including the loss of use therefrom, and (ii) is caused in whole or in part by any wrongful or negligent act or omission of Contractor, any Subcontractor, anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable, except to the extent it is caused in part by a party indemnified hereunder. Such obligation shall not be construed to negate, abridge, or otherwise reduce any other right or obligation of indemnification which would otherwise exist as to any party or person described in this Paragraph. Contractor shall similarly protect, indemnify and hold and save harmless District, its officers, officials, employees, volunteers and agents against and from any and all claims, costs, causes, actions and expenses including but not limited to legal fees, incurred by reason of Contractor's breach of any of its obligations under, or Contractor's default of, any provision of the Agreement.
- 2.11 <u>Insurance</u>: The Contractor shall purchase and maintain such insurance as will protect him/her from claims under worker's compensation acts and from claims or damages because of bodily injury, including death, and all property damage, including without limitation, which might arise during operations under this contract, whether such operations be by himself/herself or by any subcontractor or anyone directly or indirectly employed by either of them. After award of bids by the Park Board of Commissioners, Contractor shall provide a Certificate of Insurance. Failure to do so will result in loss of the contract, which will be awarded to the next lowest responsible bidder. Contractor shall maintain minimum limits of insurance no less than:
 - (a) Workman's Compensation as required by statute and Employers Liability Insurance: Employers Liability limits shall not be less than \$1,000,000 each accident for bodily injury by accident or \$1,000,000 each employee for bodily injury by disease.
 - (b) General Liability: a limit of not less than \$1,000,000 each occurrence
 - (c) Automobile Liability: limit of not less than \$500,0000 each accident

Failure to maintain the required insurance may result in termination of this Contract.

- 2.12 <u>Bid Security</u>: Each bid must be accompanied by a certified cashier's check, certified check, or a bid bond duly executed by the bidder as principal and having as surety thereon a surety company approved by the Owner, in the amount of 10% of the total bid. Such cash, checks, or bid bonds will be returned to all except the three lowest bidders within three (3) days after the opening of bids, and the remaining cash, checks, or bid bonds will be returned promptly after the Owner and the accepted bidder have executes the contract, or, if no award has been made within thirty (30) days after the date for the opening of bids, upon demand of the bidder at any time thereafter, so long as he has not been notified of the acceptance of his/her bid.
- 2.13 <u>Performance Bond:</u> Within ten (10) days after the award of contract, the successful Contractor shall furnish a Performance Bond in the amount of 100% of the contract and the payment of all obligations arising thereunder, using a form similar to the A.I.A. 311 Form or one acceptable to the Owner. The

Performance Bond will become part of the contract. The failure of the successful bidder to enter into contract and supply the required bonds within ten (10) days after the prescribed forms are presented for signature, or within such extended period as the Owner may grant, shall constitute a default and the Owner may either award the contract to the next responsible bidder or re-bid the project. A charge against the defaulting bidder may be made for the difference between the amount of the bid and the amount for which a contract for the work is subsequently executed, irrespective of whether the amount thus due exceeds the amount of the bid guarantee.

- 2.14 <u>Liquidated Damages for Failure to Enter into Contract</u>: The successful bidder, upon his/her failure to execute and deliver the contract and bond required within ten (10) days after he/she has received notice for the acceptance of his/her bid, shall forfeit to the Owner, as liquidated damages for such failure or refusal, the security deposited with his/her bid and in addition thereto, shall be liable for such damages as the Other may sustain by reason of such refusal.
- 2.15 <u>Time of Completion and Liquidation Damages:</u> Bidder shall agree to commence within fifteen (15) days after award of contract and to **fully complete the project by April 30, 2025** unless prevented by adverse weather, or schedule conflict with District programming.
- 2.16 <u>Bid Rigging or Bid Rotating</u>: The bidder by affixing his or her signature to the bid, certifies that he/she has not been barred from being awarded a contract with a unit of State or local government as a result of a violation of Section 33E-3 or 33E-4 of the Criminal Code of 1961.
- 2.17 <u>Sexual Harassment Policy</u>: Contractor certifies that it has a written sexual harassment policy that includes the following information:
 - a. The illegality of sexual harassment.
 - b. The definition of sexual harassment under State Law.
 - c. A description of sexual harassment utilizing examples.
 - d. The Contractors internal complaint process including penalties.
 - e. The legal recourse, investigative and complaint process available through the Illinois Department of Human Rights and Equal Employment Opportunity Commission.
 - f. Protection against retaliation against a person because he or she has opposed that which he or she reasonably and in good faith believes to be sexual harassment or because he or she has made a charge, filed a complaint, testified, assisted, or participated in an investigation, proceedings or hearing under the Illinois Human Rights Act or any other civil rights statute.

A copy of the policies shall be provided to the District upon request.

- 2.18 <u>Protest</u>: If bidder objects to any provision of the bid, believes the District improperly rejected your offer, or believes the selected offer is not in the Champaign Park District's best interests, bidder may submit a written protest to the Executive Director within five (5) days after the opening. Owner will consider only written protests that are properly and timely filed with the District. Owner will issue a written decision and that decision is final.
- 2.19 <u>Existing Hazardous Materials:</u> It will be the contractor's responsibility to take all necessary steps to remove the materials and to protect all persons involved with the project and all persons in the building and in the vicinity of the site from asbestos. Further, the contractor assumes all liability from asbestos exposure and removals and shall hold the Owner(s), Consultant(s), and Manufacturer(s) harmless.

A. Asbestos removal shall be governed by all regulatory agencies. This includes but is not necessarily limited to EPA, OSHA, NIOSH, NESHAP, and any other applicable codes and regulations. Contractor shall submit all copies of current guidelines. The Contractor shall remove known ACBM's in accordance with all regulations.

B. Asbestos found in flashings only shall be left in place. New flashings will be applied to existing and/or to encapsulate same.

2.20 <u>OSHA Standards:</u> All current OSHA Standards, as of now the and through the project, shall be strictly adhered to. Contractor is responsible for acquiring copies of new regulations and submitting them to the Owner, upon request.

SECTION III. SPECIFICATIONS

3.1 Locations & Descriptions

A. Dodds Park Soccer Complex: 1501 N. Mattis Ave., Champaign, IL

Remove and dispose of all existing roofing materials including all shingles, underlayment, flashing, and drip edge. Existing gutters and downspouts to be reused.

Repair/replace any damage sheathing plywood, fascia boards, and/or venting apparatuses.

Replace with McElroy metal standing seam roofing system. Roughly 4,223 sqft.

B. Dodds Park 4-Plex Softball: 1501 N. Mattis Ave., Champaign, IL

Remove and dispose of all existing roofing materials including all shingles, underlayment, flashing, and drip edge. Existing gutters and downspouts to be reused.

Repair/replace any damage sheathing plywood, fascia boards, and/or venting apparatuses.

Replace with McElroy metal standing seam roofing system. Roughly 5,161 sqft

C. Dodds Park 3-Plex Softball: 1501 N. Mattis Ave., Champaign, IL

Remove and dispose of all existing roofing materials including all shingles, underlayment, flashing, and drip edge. Existing gutters and downspouts to be reused.

Repair/replace any damage sheathing plywood, fascia boards, and/or venting apparatuses.

Replace with McElroy metal standing seam roofing system. Roughly 863 sqft

- B. Substitutions:
 - 1. Substitution Limitations
 - a. Requests for approval must be submitted in writing at least ten (10) days prior to bid date and are accompanied by all related test reports and design calculations.
 - Substitute manufacturers will be approved by written addendum to all bidders.
 Voluntary alternates will not be considered. Substitutions will not be permitted after the bid date of this project.
 - c. Roof panels proposed for substitution shall fully match the specified requirements in appearance, assembly, and performance.
- C. McElroy Metal Medallion-Lok Panels
 - 1. Profile: Vertical leg standing seam panel with male/female seams that are interlocked via snapping during installation.
 - 2. Size: 1.75" high seam by 16" width
 - 3. Panel Surface: Bead (Pencil Rib) Profile
 - 4. Material: Galvalume steel sheet conforming to ASTM A792, AZ55 coating for bare; AZ50 coating for painted; [24 standard; 22 Optional-minimum quantities may apply] gauge sheet thickness.
 - 5. Color: TBD from standard manufacturer options.

3.3 Metal Roof Panel Accessories

- A. General: Provide complete metal roof panel assembly incorporating trim, copings, fasciae, and miscellaneous flashings. Provide required fasteners, closure strips, support plates, and sealants as indicated in manufacturer's written instructions.
- B. Flashing and Trim: Match material, thickness, and finish of metal panel face sheet.
- C. Panel Clips: ASTM A 653/A 653M, G90 (Z180) hot-dip galvanized zinc coating, configured for concealment in panel joints, and identical to clips utilized in tests demonstrating compliance with performance requirements.
- D. Panel Fasteners: Self-tapping screws and other acceptable corrosion-resistant fasteners recommended by the panel manufacturer. Where exposed fasteners cannot be avoided, supply fasteners with EPDM or neoprene gaskets, with heads matching color of metal panels by means of factory-applied coating.
- E. Joint Sealers: Manufacturer's standard or recommended liquid and preformed sealers and tapes, and as follows:
 - 1. Factory-Applied Seam Sealant: Manufacturer's standard hot-melt type.
 - 2. Tape Sealers: Manufacturer's standard non-curing butyl tape, AAMA 809.2.
 - 3. Concealed Joint Sealant: Non-curing butyl, AAMA 809.2.
- F. Steel Sheet Miscellaneous Framing Components: ASTM C 645, with ASTM A 653/A 653M, G60 (Z180) hot-dip galvanized zinc coating.
- G. Misc. Roof Accessories: Approved by metal roof panel manufacturer.
- H. Snow Guards: Approved by metal roof panel manufacturer.

3.4 Installation

- A. General: Install metal roofing panels to profiles, patterns and drainage indicated and required for leak-proof installation. Provide for structural and thermal movement of work. Seal joints for leak-proof installation.
 - 1. Shim or otherwise plumb substrates receiving metal panels.
 - 2. Flash and seal metal panels at perimeter of all openings. Fasten with self-tapping screws.
 - 3. Do not begin installation until air- or water-resistive barriers and flashings that will be concealed by metal panels are installed.
 - 4. Install screw fasteners in predrilled holes for clip installation.
 - 5. Locate and space fasteners in uniform vertical and horizontal alignment.
 - 6. Install flashing and trim as metal panel work proceeds.
 - 7. Install continuous length panels.
 - 8. Align bottoms of metal panels and fasten with blind rivets, bolts, or self-tapping screws.
 - 9. Fasten flashings and trim around openings and similar elements with self-tapping screws.
 - 10. Provide weathertight EPDM Flashing for pipe- and conduit-penetrating panels.
 - 11. Seams: Provide uniform, neat seams.
 - 12. Fix panels at location depicted on reviewed shop drawings.
 - 13. Allow for required panel clearance at penetrations for thermal movement.
 - 14. Align pipe penetrations to occur at center of roof panel. Report and have corrected improperly placed penetrations before proceeding with panel installation. Remove and replace roof panels which have improperly placed penetration flashings.

- 15. Allow for required panel clearance at penetrations for thermal movement.
- 16. Fasteners: Conceal fasteners where possible in exposed work. Cover and seal fasteners and anchors for watertight and leak-proof installation.
- 17. Sealant-Type Joints: Provide sealant-type joint where indicated. Form joints to conceal sealant. Comply with Division 7 Joint Sealants Section for sealant installation.
- B. Roofing Installation:
 - 1. Install roofing plumb, true and in correct alignment with structural framing, in accordance with shop drawings and manufacturer's printed installation instructions.
 - 2. Install roofing using manufacturer's concealed fastening system or non-corroding fasteners color-matched to panel.
 - 3. Install trim using concealed fasteners where possible; sight-exposed non-corroding fasteners color-matched to trim are permitted on vertical surfaces only.
- C. Installation Tolerances:
 - 1. Variation from Plumb: Maximum 1/8" (3.2 mm) in 20 feet (6.096 m).
 - 2. Variation from Level: Maximum 1/8" (3.2 mm) in 20 feet (6.096 m).
 - 3. Variation from True Plane: Maximum 1/4" (3.2 mm) in 20 feet (6.096 m).
- D. Underlayment Installation:
 - 1. Underlayment to be supplied by metal roof panel manufacturer.
 - 2. Self-adhered High-Temperature Underlayment: Provide self-adhering, cold-applied, sheet underlayment, a minimum of 40 mils thick adhesive, with release-paper backing. Provide primer when recommended by underlayment manufacturer.
 - 3. Thermal Stability: Stable after testing at 240 degree F; ASTM D1970.
 - 4. Low-Temperature Flexibility: Passes after testing at minus 20 degree F; ASTM D1970.
- E. Accessory Installation: Install accessories using techniques recommended by manufacturer and which will assure positive anchorage to building and weathertight mounting. Provide for thermal movement. Coordinate installation with flashings and other components
- F. Flashing and Trim Installation: Comply with performance requirements, manufacturer's written installation instructions, and the SMACNA "Architectural Sheet Metal Manual." Provide concealed fasteners where possible, and install units to true level. Install work with laps, joints, and seams that will be permanently watertight.
- G. Metal Roof Curbs: .063 minimum thickness welded aluminum, or 18 gauge minimum welded stainless steel, factory-insulated, with integral cricket, and designed to fit roof panel module, sized to meet specification.

3.5 <u>Cleaning</u>

- A. Cleaning: Remove temporary coverings and protection of adjacent work areas.
- B. Repair or replace damaged installed products.
- C. Clean installed products in accordance with manufacturer's instructions prior to Owner's acceptance.
- D. Remove construction debris from project site and legally dispose of debris.

3.6 Protection

- A. Protection: Protect installed product's finish surfaces from damage during construction:
 - 1. Protect installed products from damage by subsequent construction activities.
 - 2. Replace products having damage other than minor finish damage.
 - 3. Repair products having minor damage to finish in accordance with panel Manufacturer's recommendation
 - 4. Owner shall be sole judge of acceptability of repair to damaged finishes; replace products having rejected repairs.

3.7 <u>Warranty</u>

- A. Product Warranty:
 - 1. Panel Material: Furnish manufacturers 45 year warranty covering the panel against rupture, structural failure, or perforation.
 - 2. Panel Coating: Furnish manufacturer's 40-year warranty covering cracking, checking, and peeling, and 30 year warranty covering fade and chalk on the Two coat coil applied, baked on full strength (70% resin, PVF2) fluorocarbon coating.
- B. Special Warranty: Installer's standard form in which installer agrees to repair or replace panels that fail due to poor workmanship or faulty installation within the specified warranty period.

3.8 Project Conditions

- A. Field Measurements: Verify actual measurements/openings by field measurements before fabrication; show recorded measurements on shop drawings.
- B. Weather Limitations: Proceed with installation only when existing and forecasted weather conditions permit assembly of metal panels to be performed in accordance with manufacturers' written instructions and warranty requirements.

3.9 Quality Assurance

- A. Manufacturer Qualifications:




