## **REPORT TO PARK BOARD**

**SUBJECT:** Health Insurance Renewal Preparation

### Background

As part of the Champaign Park District's (Park District) annual health insurance renewal process, the Park District's benefits broker has provided preliminary claims information for the period of May 1, 2025 through April 30, 2026. Current claims data reflects a medical and pharmacy loss ratio of approximately 181%, meaning claims paid significantly exceeded premiums collected during the aforementioned period. Total claims paid were approximately \$1.5 million, with eight high-cost claimants accounting for approximately 52% of all claims incurred.

Based on current utilization and market conditions, the Park District's broker has advised that a renewal increase in the range of 30% to 40% is possible. Actual renewal rates will not be available until later this year; however, the current claims experience suggests that the Park District should prepare for a significant increase from BCBS.

### Discussion

Given the information previously provided to the Board regarding wellness initiatives, alternative plan designs, health insurance comparables from local organizations and industry peers, and various cost-containment approaches, staff are seeking guidance on which options the Board would like to explore or understand further. This may include strategies such as plan design modifications, Health Reimbursement Arrangements (HRAs), Health Savings Account (HSA) incentives, wellness incentives, or other approaches intended to help manage future healthcare costs.
